# GRATEFUL FOR THE PEWS

When I was just getting started in ministry, Maureen and I invited the church's college students over to our apartment for a homecooked meal. We borrowed some tables from the church to seat everyone ... and after the meal, as they were helping us clean up, they removed the tableclothes and saw all the graffiti on the tables. They spent the next 20 minutes telling stories and laughing about writing on the tables when they were in Middle School!

On Saturday, Mike Bowles will take 8 of our pews and transport them to his grandfather's church. We know they are going to a good home and rejoice that they will continue to welcome people to worship, but saying goodbye to them still stings a little bit.

Those pews have served us well for six decades and some of you can remember the people who regularly set in them and the times when the sanctuary was full to overflowing - weddings, funerals, special concerts, and Christmas Eve. Those pews are full of memories, so removing them feels like the end of an era.

Of course this is not the first time we've removed pews — we did so when the organ was installed and once before to accommodate wheelchairs in the back. I know we will make more memories with the new chairs, but grieving the removal of these pews is not only appropriate, it is necessary! So, I hope you will join me in a little remembering.

### Going Solar

This week, Patti Salisbury, as president of the corporation, signed a contract with Solar Holler, formalizing what the Session had already approved we are gong solar! It will be spring before the work will begin, replacing the shingles and placing the panels, but by the summer of 2024, we will be generating all our own electricity! While there are significant upfront costs to install the equipment, we expect to save at least \$107,244 over the next 25 years! (More if utility rates increase more than 3 % per year.)

This is one way the Session is planning for our future!

Our Advent Study this year will return us to *The First Advent in Palestine* (the book Todd used for his Christmas in July sermon series)


We will be looking at four chapters that he didn't cover in his preaching:

# **NURTURING FAITH IDEAS**



Mur uring I have a plant on my desk that came with clear instructions on how to nurture it - optimum sunlight, water, and temperature.

'Wouldn't it be nice to have similar information to help us nurture our own faith ... or that of our children or grandchildren? Well, the Presbytery of WV is providing weekly ideas for nurturing faith.

**December 3:** Advent begins today. This season of the church year is when we prepare ourselves to welcome Jesus as a baby. This is a busy season with church services, decorating, concerts, parties, shopping and getting ready to visit with family members we might not see often. In the busyness of the season, don't forget why we are celebrating. How will you prepare your heart to welcome Jesus into your life once again?

**December 10:** Mark 1:1-8 introduces us to John the Baptist. John was Jesus' cousin, and his role in the story of Jesus was to prepare people for Jesus. What are ways that you and your family are preparing for Christmas? What are ways that you can help people in your community prepare for Jesus? If your church doesn't already do it, encourage them to go Christmas caroling, to bring some joy into people's lives.

**December 17:** One of the lectionary passages this morning is 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24. This is a letter to the church at Thessalonica. They are told that they are to rejoice always, to pray without ceasing, and to give thanks in all circumstances. Who and what are you praying for today? What are you thankful for?

December 24: It's Christmas Eve. As you prepare to exchange gifts with family and friends tomorrow, what gift will you bring to Jesus this year?

**December 31:** The Gospel lesson today is from Luke 2:22-40. We are introduced to two very old people named Anna and Simeon. When Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the Temple for the first time, these two knew immediately that Jesus was the one they had been waiting for all of these years. They knew Jesus was the one who would bring hope and salvation to the people. As a disciple of Jesus, think of ways that you can bring
