I have been guided by the gentle wisdom of Mr. Rogers all my life. Maybe you have too.

I thought of him again this week, in the wake of yet another school



shooting. Mr. Rogers is famous for saying, "When I was a child and would see scary things on the news, my mother would tell me, 'Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping." Where are the helpers? Could you be one?


He also said, "Children need adults who realize that losses to children are every bit as painful as losses to adults." Are we ready to listen to their pain? Are we ready to comfort?

And "Feelings are mentionable, and whatever is mentionable can be more manageable." What are you feeling right now? Are you able to express it? What does you faith allow you to say in response to tragedy?

When we talk to our children about the events in Texas, we are able to draw on the wisdom of Mr. Rogers. He also helps us as we try to answer our own questions.

As many of you know, Fred Rodgers was an ordained Presbyterian minister. The denomination has set aside the Sunday closest to his birthday to celebrate his ministry. That date didn't suit our plans, but we <u>are</u> going to celebrate him on Sunday, June 12th. The service will focus on Ephesians 6:10-20 which talks about putting on the whole armor of God, which will make you ready to "proclaim the gospel of peace".

So slip on a cardigan sweater and listen for his wisdom.



Great Prayers of the OT

Prayers are as common as breathing for a worshiping people. Prayer is a powerful link between humanity and God! The language of prayer can be beautiful ... and yet, some people don't feel comfortable praying. They are unsure about how to pray, or what words to use, or when it is appropriate to pray.

Professor Walter Brueggemann has collected a series of "Great Prayers" from the Old Testament that promises to help us become better prayers.

We'll start a sermon series based on these "Great Prayers" this summer.



June 5 - Day of Pentecost:

Read: John 14:8-17

In John 14, Jesus promises his disciples that if they love him and follow his commandments, the Father will send an Advocate to be with them forever. As believers, we also have an Advocate we call the Holy Spirit. On this Pentecost Sunday, consider what that means to have an advocate with you forever. How does that affect the way you live, speak, and act?


June 12 - Trinity Sunday:

Read: John 16:12-15

On this Trinity Sunday, we read in John the role of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the disciples. The Spirit leads all believers in the way of God's truth and guides believers to behold God's glory and might. What does this mean for you? How do you recognize God's glory and might? Do you allow the Spirit to lead you in the ways of God, or do you choose to follow your own paths in this life on earth?

June 19 - Second Sunday after Pentecost: Read Luke 8:26-39

In Luke, we see Jesus met by a man filled with demons. He calls to Jesus as soon as he sees him arrive. Jesus commands the demons to come out, and he sends them into a herd of swine, which drown. The reaction of the people was not one of awe but of fear, so Jesus left. When you become aware of the miracles of Jesus, do you run in fear or worship and adore? Your answer makes all the difference in your life.
