Maureen Wright was elected as the Presbytery of West Virginia Lead Presbyter and Stated Clerk at the November stated meeting on Saturday, November 15, 2025.

Rev. Julie Olt, who led the search committee said, "Throughout our interviews, we were deeply impressed by Maureen's ability to artfully connect the mission of the Lead Presbyter role directly to Scripture. She has already demonstrated exceptional leadership by proactively implementing the new strategic plan and guiding the presbytery toward its future vision."

Maureen has served as a Christian Educator at churches in North Carolina and earned her certification from the PC (USA) as a Christian Educator in 2004. She was ordained as a ruling elder by Village Chapel Presbyterian Church in Charleston, WV, on January 8, 2012. Wright has faithfully served the Presbytery of West Virginia as Stated Clerk since 2013 and Associate Congregational Support from 2016 to 2023. In 2023, She stepped in to the Transitional General Presbyter and Stated Clerk role.

Stewardship Update

On Dedication Sunday, Nov. 9th, people placed their pledges in a basket, or sent them in by mail, or used the "give" button on the website. As a result, we have received pledges of \$173,758 toward the 2026 budget which allows us to do the ministry God has called us to do! Thank you for your generosity! 

Nurturing faith ideas



I have a plant on my desk that came Mur uring with clear instructions on how to nurture it - optimum sunlight, water, and temperature. 'Wouldn't it

be nice to have similar information to help us nurture our own faith... or that of our children or grandchildren? Well, the Presbytery of WV is providing weekly ideas for nurturing faith.

November 23: Christ the King/Reign of Christ Read Luke 23:33-43

Jesus was a king though he wasn't the kind of king that the people expected. He was the kind of king that died on a cross out of love, not a king who ruled a country and controlled people. On this Sunday before Thanksgiving, remember all of the things Jesus did and how he showed God's love. Give thanks to God for the gift of his son, Jesus, Christ the King.

November 30: First Sunday of Advent Read Matthew 24:36-44

In the season of Advent that leads up to Christmas, we look back to the past, to the birth of Jesus as a baby in Bethlehem as we prepare to celebrate his birth again. We also, in this season, look forward, to the return of Christ on earth. This passage reminds us that we don't know when Christ will return but we should always be ready for him.

December 7: Second Sunday of Advent Read Matthew 3:1-2

As John the Baptist was sent to prepare the way for Jesus, so must we prepare ourselves for Jesus. This is a time of hope and preparation. During Advent, reflect on what preparations you are making in your life and in your heart for the coming of Jesus.

December 14: Third Sunday of Advent Read Luke 1:46b-55

When the angel Gabriel visited Mary to tell her that God had chosen her to be the mother of God's son, Gabriel also told Mary that her relative Elizabeth, who was up in years, was also pregnant. After Mary greeted Elizabeth, she sang praise to God for what God was doing in her and in the world. In her words she proclaimed that God was turning the world upside down. What do you see that God is doing in the world today that is changing the world? Share with a friend or family member.
