#### THRIVING CONGREGATIONS

Would you like to be a thriving congregation? (Sounds like a trick question, doesn't it?)

Helen Warren and I traveled to Montreat October 3-5 for a retreat paid for by the Lilly Endowment and taught by the Black Mountain School of Theology! We presented what we learned to most of the rest of the core team — Sandy Bowles, Bob Hiser, Teresa Lawlor, and Betsy White (Roger and Rita Sockman were away) on Monday, the 17th. Our overall goal will be to "thin the line between the congregation and our community". To that end we're learning and practicing two skills — one on one conversations to get to know each other better and qualitative observations to notice the details of what is going on before/during/and after worship.

We will be meeting monthly and expanding the group of people so we can draw on a wider set of experiences and insights. We will also have monthly coaching sessions with the faculty.


#### Dear friends,

October 30 – Twenty-First Sunday after Pentecost:

Read 2 Thessalonians 1:1-4

In this passage, we are taught it is right and just to praise the Lord, even when people won't listen. We are reminded, again, to stay faithful in our Lord. How do you profess your faith in God? What are some ways you can spread the good news of our Lord?

## November 6 – Twenty-Second Sunday after Pentecost:

Read 2 Thessalonians 2:1-5, 13-17

Paul tells the believers in Thessalonica to not be alarmed about rumors of the coming 'Day of the Lord,' but rather to hold fast to the truth they have been taught. What worries and anxieties is the Spirit inviting you to let go of right now? How do we discern what faith 'traditions' are worth holding on to, and which have served their purpose?

## November 13 – Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost:

Read Isaiah 65:17-25

The prophet is painting a beautiful picture of the 'New Heavens and New Earth' in his final chapters. What images in this passage speak to your deep hopes and desires? How do we cultivate this vision of shalom in our world today, knowing that its final culmination can only be the work of Christ?

## November 20 - Christ the King Sunday: Read: Luke 23:33-43


