LENT COMES

Every year, when the skies are grey and the cold has seeped into our bones, Lent comes. It begins with shadows and ashes and a reminder that in life and in death we belong to God. It builds through weeks of study and reflection as we take part in a simple meal and Bible study (on forgiveness) and mark the days with devotions. The Sunday scriptures will trace the progress of Jesus toward the cross and the reason for it. But all the while something is growing and our hearts quicken in response! The alleyway will burst into color with daffodils and our hearts will rejoice as Easter draws near! Lent helps us prepare for this transformation ... every year!

So, plan to welcome the start of Lent by taking part in the Ash Wednesday service on Feb. 14 and taking part in communion on Feb. 18. It'll do your heart good!

ELDER RETREAT SUMMARY

The Session met January 19-20 for a retreat, despite the snow! On Friday we elected John France president of the corporation; re-elected Rose Ann Walker as clerk; elected Greg and Terri Rader as co-treasurers; and re-elected Leslie Bremar as asst. treasurer. We heard more about Guns to Gardens and agreed that Sarah Gottlieb would make a presentation on February 18 about the event and receive a special offering for it. Finally, we heard a report about the need to remove the steeple to assess and address leaks. Doing so will cost about \$10,000. This is addition to \$49,000 to re-shingle the sanctuary roof. We have received gifts from anonymous donors of \$30,000 but will need to raise the rest. The session approved an envelope d campaign to do so, starting in February. (more on this on page 3)

On Saturday we drafted people to serve on ministry teams; evaluated 2023 and our ministry in the community; discussed the next steps in the Thriving Congregations process; and dreamed a little about what we might do in 2024. We also passed a budget for 2024 that includes a 3% raise for staff in response to inflation.

There will be a **meeting of the congregation on February 4** to present the budget, vote on any changes to the terms of Todd's call, and share MT reports.

Solar Holler Presentation

About 20 folks stayed after church this past Sunday to hear Thomas Ramey speak about the benefits of going solar. He recounted that he hasn't paid an electric bill since he made the switch several years ago. He told us that several county school systems are "renting" solar systems from Solar Holler in order to reduce their cost by 15-25%. While the church has decided to purchase the equipment and reap all the benefits, homeowners might rather "rent" and avoid the upfront installation costs.



Ramey distributed sign-up cards for a free estimate. (Anyone can get one.) If they end up going solar as a result, Solar Holler will give the church a \$400 credit!

ASHES TO GO

Mostly, our faith is private. We can go to the grocery store or to school or to work and no one can tell that we are Christians by looking at us. But on Ash Wednesday we step forward and are marked with ashes and hear the words "in life and in death, you are the Lord's.) And then



for the rest of the day we wear those ashes for anyone/ everyone to see!

What a bold declaration! And an invitation to conversation! Prior to COVID we offered Ashes to Go in public places around the city, so that people could participate in this tradition. We are planning to do so again.

Details are still being worked out—we've got calls in to some high profile places—but the plan it for Amy and Todd to offer them from 11-1 along with a simple blessing. They'd love to have help! Let them know if you are interested by contacting the church office.




LENT 2024 AT VCPC February 14 - March 30


LENTEN DINNER & STUDY 2024



Jim spent the Sunday School hour clearing the sidewalks around the church as the snow fell, and Barbara staffed the sound mixer so Don would be free to help with music.



What's an envelope campaign?

When the Stewardship MT met with Ellie Johns-Kelley, regional representative of the Presbyterian Foundation, recently to ask advice on how to best finance repairs to the sanctuary roof, we discussed several options: a full blown capital campaign, a loan, or an envelope campaign.

She recommended an envelope campaign — put together 200 envelopes numbered 1-200 and ask each individual to take one and give at least the amount on the envelope. So a person with one marked 7 could participate for just \$7 and a person who took one marked 156 could give \$156, or more. If everyone did that, we'd raise over 20,000 — close to what is needed!

We liked that anyone could participate and even the highest amount is not overly burdensome!

To be clear, this would only fund removing the steeple to assess and address the leaking and to re-shingle the sanctuary roof. More funds will be needed, perhaps another envelope campaign another year, to replace the steeple.

NURTURING FAITH IDEAS

January 28: Read Mark 1:21-28

Jesus taught with authority. What are some stories you know of Jesus teaching others? Write down some of the things Jesus taught us. Which of Jesus' teachings mean the most to you? How might you teach others what Jesus taught you?

February 4: Read Mark 1:29-39

As Jesus begins his ministry, his life takes on a rhythm of action (teaching and healing) and prayer and solitude. His time by himself in prayer perhaps confirms his calling: "This is why I have come." Reflect on your own life. How does it have a rhythm to it? Do you find time to be nurtured by God in solitude and silence so that you can engage with the world from a place of centered Presence?

February 11: Read Mark 9:2-9

Jesus orders the disciples to not tell anyone what they had seen. Reflect on why he would order this of the disciples. Why would he not want others to know about this experience? What is most important to Jesus? Have you ever had an amazing experience of God? Did you tell anyone about it? Why or why not?

February 18: Read Mark 1:9-15

Jesus' life and call are affirmed and confirmed through his experience of baptism. Reflect on what your baptism means to you. Every time you encounter water this week, perhaps as you wash dishes or pour yourself a drink, be reminded that you are God's beloved child. Hear God tell you, "With you I am well-pleased." Notice your feelings, both emotional and physical, as you rest in God's love for you.
